

## Shueyville City Council Meeting – April 12, 2022

Mayor Coonfare called the regular monthly meeting of the Shueyville City Council to order at 6:31 pm on Tuesday, April 12, 2022 in the council chambers at the Shueyville Community Center.

**Roll Call** – Council present in chambers: Mickey Coonfare, Bart Frisk, Chris Lacy, Patty Stephens, Brent Foss. Absent: Becky Neuhaus

**Also present:** Dave Schechinger, Leah Kolar, Randy Russell, Janice Horak, Nancy Brown

**Citizen's Comments Items not on Agenda:** Questions about utility work on 120<sup>th</sup> St. NE: when the work will be completed is unknown at this time. A thank you to Chris Lacy for cleaning sand off the streets. Topic of using less sand and more salt on roads next winter was mentioned.

**Consent Agenda:** Comments on Treasurer's Report for March: noted that Exchange State Bank account is closed; all funds are with Central State Bank in Swisher. Comments on building permit 704 for a storage building at 1302 Southview Lane NE: permit is not approved due to storage building size requiring greater setback from the property line. No comments on: Agenda, Minutes from March 8, 2022 Council Meeting, Summary List of Claims, Sheriff's Report, Licenses/Permits issued: 2; inground pool at 1336 Spring Ridge Court, single family home construction at 3009 Forest Ridge Drive. Motioned by Lacy to approve the Consent Agenda with the exception of building permit #704, seconded by Foss. All Ayes, motion carried 4-0.

### Business:

- A. Motioned by Foss, seconded by Frisk to approve Resolution 2022-08; Resignation of City Clerk/Treasurer, Roll Call, all ayes, motion carried 4-0
- B. Motioned by Lacy, seconded by Foss to approve Resolution 2022-09; Appointment of City Clerk/Treasurer, Roll Call, all ayes, motion carried 4-0
- C. Discussion on proposal from L.L. Pelling Company to sweep the road and clean chips out of the grass at the cul-de-sac on Skyview Lane NE for \$1500. Mayor Coonfare questioned whether City should have to pay since the rock didn't absorb properly into the oil and citizens have pointed out rock piles and a pothole forming. Information shared by City Engineer Dave Schechinger: original proposal from L.L. Pelling Company did not include sweeping. The weather and timing of application of chip and seal roads is crucial to the rock absorption into the oil and was noted in the specs on original proposal. Pothole will be fixed. Motioned by Foss to approve sweeping proposal. Seconded by Frisk. All Ayes, motion carried 4-0.
- D. Discussion on removing wood and debris from city culverts, as discovered by Brown Concrete and Backhoe while cleaning up manholes. Noted that Boomerang did come out to remove the debris. Question regarding culvert on James Ave: appears to be flagged for work, but unclear if work was completed. Schechinger following up on this.
- E. Discussion on implementing an emergency snow ordinance like that of City of Swisher. Ordinance would prohibit parking on street if more than 2 inches of snow has accumulated. Sending to P&Z Commission to review.
- F. Discussion on proposal from Frontline Warning Systems for continued annual service of outdoor warning sirens. Motioned by Stephens to approve, seconded by Frisk. All Ayes, motion carried.
- G. Discussion on use of American Rescue Plan Funds of \$48,805.25. Planning for CPR classes to be held at Community Center. Discussion of funds to be donated to Jefferson Monroe Fire Department for purchase of equipment for CPR classes. Discussion of purchasing AED for Community Center. Lacy to follow up on cost for AED.
- H. Discussion on PulsePoint AED enclosure. Prefer to purchase our own AED using American Rescue Plan Funds.

### Correspondence, Announcements & Comments:

- Lacy attended Jefferson Monroe Fire Department dedication for a new fire truck.
- Boomerang will be reseeded along Curtis Bridge Road as needed.
